1. Aims

This policy aims to:

- Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers.
- Explain how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010.
- Clarify our expectations for school uniform.

At Honilands Primary we believe that uniform is important. It helps pupils to feel part of a community and reinforces our ethos 'We Are One'. It sets a standard which supports expectations of work and behaviour, and helps maintain the right discipline for learning.

2. Our school's legal duties under the Equality Act 2010

The Equality Act 2010 prohibits discrimination against an individual based on protected characteristics, which include sex, race, religion or belief, and gender reassignment.

To avoid discrimination, our school will:

- Avoid listing uniform items based on sex, to give all pupils the opportunity to wear the uniform they feel most comfortable in.
- Make sure that uniform costs the same for all pupils.
- Allow all pupils to have long hair, provided it is tied back when necessary for health and safety.
- Allow pupils to style their hair in a way that is appropriate for school but also comfortable.
- Allow pupils to request changes to uniform or PE/swimwear for religious reasons.
- Allow pupils to wear headscarves in white, black or red.
- Allow for adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality by contacting the school.

3. Limiting the cost of school uniform

Honilands has a duty to make sure the uniform we require is affordable, in line with statutory DfE guidance.

We will make sure our uniform:

- Is available at a reasonable cost.
- Provides the best value for money for families.
- Minimises distinctive branded items.

- Avoids frequent changes.
- Offers second-hand uniform through school collections.

4. Expectations for school uniform

4.1 Our school's uniform

- Dark grey or black trousers (or shorts in summer)
- Dark grey or black skirt or pinafore
- Red polo shirt
- Red sweatshirt or black cardigan (school logo optional)
- Black school shoes or plain all black trainers (including soles)
- Bows in hair should be a reasonable size and in white, black or red
- Headscarves should be white, black or red

PE Kit:

- Plain black shorts or tracksuit bottoms
- Plain red t-shirt
- Plain black trainers or plimsols

Jewellery:

- Only one pair of stud earrings may be worn.
- Watches may be worn but must be removed for PE.
- The school cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage.

4.2 Where to purchase it

Uniform can be purchased from local suppliers and supermarkets. Branded items with the Honilands logo are available from our chosen supplier. Second-hand items are available through the school office.

5. Expectations for our school community

Pupils are expected to wear the correct uniform at all times on site, when travelling to and from school, and when representing the school.

Parents are expected to ensure their child has the correct uniform, that it is clean, labelled, and in good condition. Requests for adaptations should be made directly to the school.

Staff will monitor compliance and support families where financial hardship is a barrier. Governors will ensure the policy is fair, affordable and inclusive.

6. Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed annually by the Headteacher and approved by the Governing Board.

Red:

-Polo shirt

-Sweatshirt/ cardigan/ fleece

-Red and white checked summer dress



Dark grey or black:

-Trousers or shorts in summer

-Skirt

-Pinafore dress



-Red, grey or white socks or tights

-Black leather shoes or trainers
(No logos or colours)



-Red, black or white hijabs and hair accessories only

-A small red book bag



PE Uniform

-Plain red T-shirt

-Plain black tracksuit bottoms or shorts

-Black plimsolls or trainers



**No make-up, false nails or jewellery— only small stud earrings allowed
